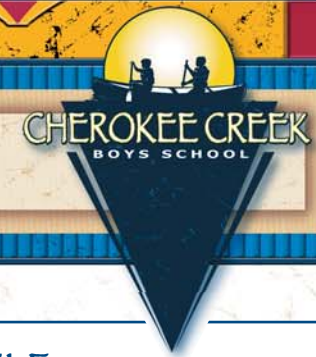


CHEROKEE CREEK BOYS SCHOOL Fact Sheet

Students with Exceptionalities: CCBS is able to serve students with a range of Learning Disabilities, Emotional Disabilities and Other Health Impairments ranging from mild to moderate with average and above intelligence. The Special Services Department of our local school district provides a full range of supplemental services for students enrolling with an IEP.

Team Approach – Each student is a member of a team of up to 12 boys

Care Team – Led by a Primary Counselor and Licensed Therapist, this team also includes Clinical Manager, Psychiatric Nurse, Family and Student Services Coordinator and Teachers
